PROLOGUE: MY RACING ROVENTURE

In August 2010, I got an unexpected invitation to participate in a unique racing event at Thunderhill Raceway. The organizers had come up with a creative concept called the "Preacher Feature," where local pastors would trade in their sermons for stock car racing, competing against each other on a hot Texas Saturday night. The stock cars were generously provided by actual drivers who were set to compete that evening. Even though I had no experience behind the wheel of a racecar, I found myself intrigued and excited to join in the fun.

On Friday, I arrived at the track for an initial test drive, accompanied by my friend Stan, an avid NASCAR fan with a twinkle of excitement in his eyes. As I navigated the car around the track, the engine roared in a way that made my heart race with anticipation. Stan urged me to push the car to its limits, insisting that only then would I truly grasp how it handled. The atmosphere buzzed with adrenaline. That first day ended up being pretty

uneventful, and I looked forward to Saturday's race. Or maybe it was just supposed to be an exhibition. I was not really sure.

The next day, I returned for a warm-up, only to discover that the event's organizer was a skilled racer. During the warm-up laps, I found myself racing alongside this seasoned driver. For an exhilarating moment, I really believed I could outrun him. But just as my confidence surged, I hit a treacherous stretch of gravel known as the "trash," which dangerously covered the edge of the track. Suddenly, the car slipped from my control, sending me barreling toward the grandstand. Panic surged through me; all I could do was cling to the steering wheel and utter a silent prayer, convinced this might be my last ride.

In a heartbeat, I crashed into a stack of tires that served as a buffer between the chaotic track and the eager spectators. The impact jolted the car to a sudden halt, leaving me shaken but miraculously unharmed. A flood of emotions swirled in me, a chaotic blend of fear, disbelief, and relief. My heart raced far faster than the car had, and with no speedometer to gauge my velocity, I could only wonder how fast I had been going.

As thick black smoke billowed into the sky from the damaged vehicle and the tire barrier, I braced myself for the inevitable conclusion of my racing experience. However, the supportive team rallied around me, encouraging a comeback and quickly finding another vehicle for me to drive. That evening, when I finally slid into the new car, I had a more cautious approach, pressing the accelerator tentatively, much to the embarrassment of my family who watched in disbelief. It reminded me of a scene from *Talladega Nights*, where Ricky Bobby returns to the track after his accident,

while sleek racers sped past him, oblivious to the nervousness in my heart.

Fortunately, a mix-up in the officials' notes led to my name being confused with another driver's, allowing me to slip under the radar in spite of my slow pace. This concluded my brief and tumultuous career as a race car driver, a bittersweet chapter that taught me a valuable lesson: I wouldn't expect a professional racer to step into my shoes and tackle the ministry as I do, just as they wouldn't anticipate me to compete at the high-octane level of their world. And that's my story, a wild ride etched in my memory.

I'm thankful to have survived and walked away from the crash. But when it comes to finances, there are many road hazards and wrecked vehicles along the track. However, you can avoid a financial crash.

That day at Thunderhill Raceway taught me that it's one thing to sit in the driver's seat and quite another to actually handle the car. The same is true with our finances. It's easy to think we're in control until life throws us a curve, a financial crisis, unexpected expense, or a debt spiral that sends us spinning off course.

I often thought about the financial priorities on my list: rent, car payments, utilities, credit cards, and other unexpected expenses. These are typical worries that we all face. The truth is, I also wanted

something for myself, and that selfish part of me questioned why I needed to give 10%.

It took me a while to surrender that part of myself. But then, my family began experiencing significant health crises, and once again, money, along with medical concerns, became the center of our stress and anxiety. One night, I found myself praying restlessly to God, worried about how I would pay my mortgage and the other bills on my list. In that moment of chaos, God's Word broke through my worries and reminded me of the story of the fish and loaves. I realized I needed to start bringing my concerns to God and giving my full 10% consistently, first.

Suddenly, I felt a wave of calmness and clarity, knowing that I would be okay. Slowly but surely, God took my offering and multiplied it. My family members received the financial assistance they needed for medical costs, a wonderful group of women (shout out to the Soul Sisters) gathered \$200 for my father's treatments, and I was offered a full-time position at my current job.

It's incredible what God can do when you truly trust Him and give without any expectation other than His provision. I am always reminded of the young boy with the basket of fish and loaves, who chose to give what little he had to Jesus rather than keep it for himself. Tithing has become an integral part of my faith and my financial life. It is a surrender of myself and a realization that God makes the most of what I give.
